
























By Defendant's/Current Home Owners:

-  Is the sale held at my house?
-  No the sale is conducted at the Sheriff's Office.
-  Can I request more time to stay in my home?
-  Yes, you are entitled to two, four week postponements. These can be used individually or together.
 -  **This request must be submitted in writing prior to the sale date.** We have a form letter available on our website at: <http://www.co.cumberland.nj.us/sheriffsales> . Or you can write your own letter.
 -  The letter must include: Your name, address, the current sale date, the number of adjournments requested, a brief reason for the request and your signature.
 -  **You may fax this request to 856-459-0452,** mail it or bring it in person to the Sheriff's Office located at 220 North Laurel Street Bridgeton, NJ 08302.
 -  Once we receive your request for 1 or 2 postponements we process the request and send a letter to the plaintiff's attorney letting them know you used a postponement and the new sales date.
 -  A copy is sent to you in the mail for your records.
-  What if I need more time?
-  The Sheriff is unable to grant anymore time.
 -  **You may** apply to the court for an emergent stay using form 11277. The court will be able to provide more information on how to proceed with this process.

-  What happens if I file bankruptcy?
-  Proof of your bankruptcy must be received in our office.
 -  We inform the plaintiff's attorney of your bankruptcy and wait for further instructions.
-  Do I have to be out of my home by the sale date?
-  The short answer is no. You do have a 10 day redemption period in which you may be able to save your home.
-  What if I don't leave the home after the sale and the new homeowner wants me to leave?
-  **You may** be served with a Writ of Possession, this states you have 15 days to vacate the home. After the 15 days the new owner will schedule a lock out date.
